HCI'S PROGRAMS

The P.I.E.™ (Partners in Excellence™ Mentoring Program) matches a local professional with a teen and provides them with another caring adult in their lives to help them achieve their full potential.

The HCI Optimist Club at Penncrest High School is a collaboration with the Rose Tree Media Optimist club helps teens develop teamwork and leadership skills.

The S.P.O.T. Network (Supervised Programs Organized for Teens) provides safe places throughout our community for middle and high school age youth to gather after school, evenings and weekends, with many activities and special events offered.

Girls Teen Leadership Program at Springton Lake Middle School is a collaboration with the Women's Resource Center providing 7th and 8th grade girls with the skills needed to become effective leaders and accomplishing personal goals.

Mock Crash and Survivor 101 at Penncrest High School in partnership with Riddle Healthcare Foundation and State Farm Insurance. A realistic event educating students on the dangers of drinking and/or using drugs and then operating a vehicle, including other distractions like texting.
